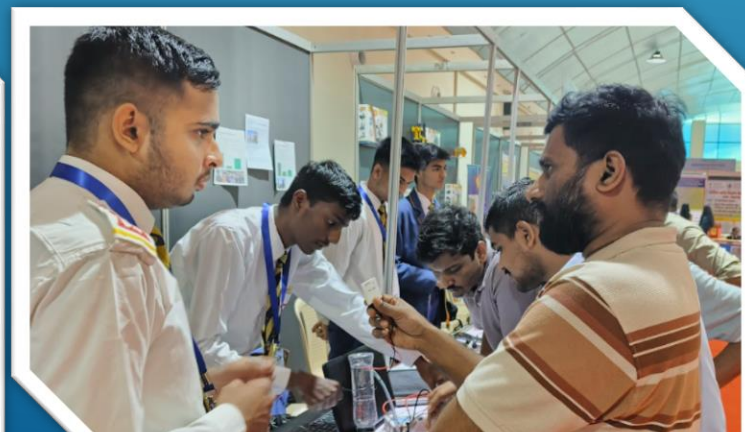

ECO-INNOVATION LED BY YOUNG CHANGEMAKERS

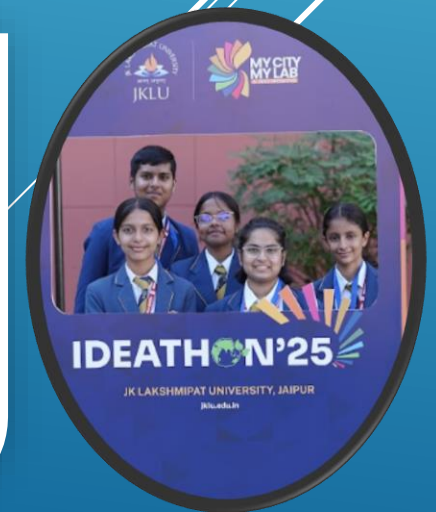

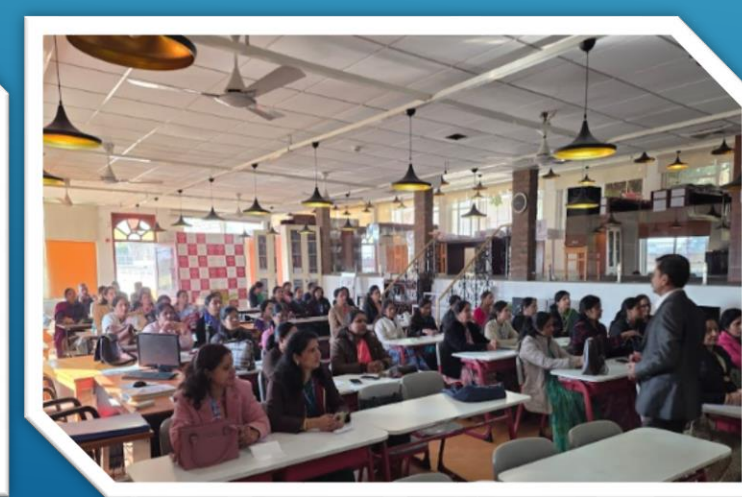

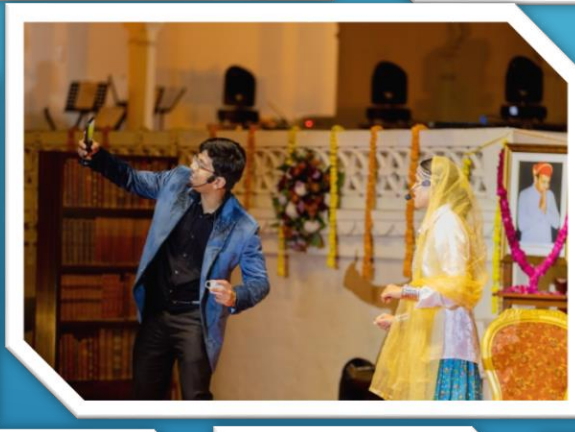
AN EVENING OF PRIDE, HONOUR AND CULTURAL SPLENDOUR

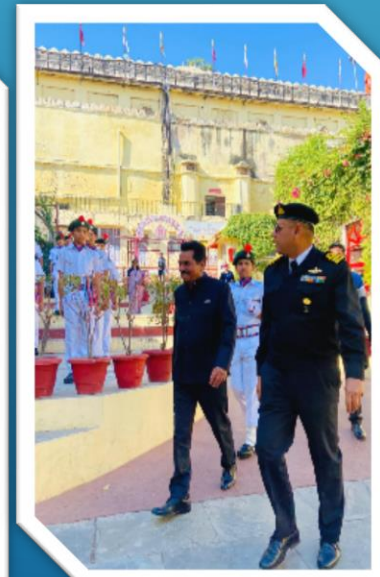
NCC CADETS PAY TRIBUTE ON ARMED FORCES FLAG DAY

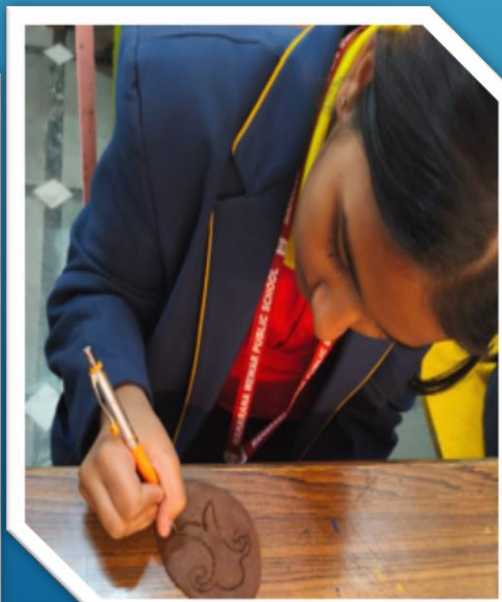
MMPS HERITAGE CLUB SHOWCASING MEWAR'S CULTURAL LEGACY
